Dear Friends in Christ,

On May 19th we will gather with five other congregations on the Courthouse lawn for a joint Pentecost service. It's fitting for us to celebrate this particular festival with other churches because Pentecost marks the coming of the Holy Spirit to Jesus' followers after his ascension, as well as the beginning of the Christian Church's mission to the world. Worshipping with other Christians helps us recognize our common call to share the good news about the life that's available to all people through Jesus' death and resurrection. It reminds us that we don't do this work alone and acknowledges our dependence on the Holy Spirit to fulfill this call. To kick off our celebration, I would like to share this affirmation of faith that highlights the Holy Spirit's role in our lives and world.

Affirmation: We Sing of the Spirit

We sing of God the Spirit,

who from the beginning has swept over the face of creation,

animating all energy and matter

and moving in the human heart.

We sing of God the Spirit,

faithful and untamable,

who is creatively and redemptively active in the world.

The Spirit challenges us to celebrate the holy

not only in what is familiar,

but also in that which seems foreign.

We sing of the Spirit,

who speaks our prayers of deepest longing and enfolds our concerns and confessions, transforming us and the world.

We offer worship

as an outpouring of gratitude and awe and a practice of opening ourselves to God's still, small voice of comfort, to God's rushing whirlwind of challenge. Through word, music, art, and sacrament, in community and in solitude, A quote from Martin Luther: "We are all Christians, and must bear with each other and yield, in many things; for we are all one body, and we are placed together here on earth for the sole reason that we may, through love, serve one another."

Alleluia! He is risen! He is risen indeed! We have now entered the season of Early Pentecost beginning June 2 and continuing through August 25. This is the season of green so you will notice the green paraments as you enter the sanctuary. Our liturgy will consists of components from the new hymnal supplement <u>All Creation Sings</u>. We have been singing many of the beautiful hymns from this resource already. Our Hymn of Praise: **Glory to you, God** will be taken from Setting 12. The Communion Setting with be two different hymns: **Holy, Holy, Holy,** and **In This Feast of Love.** The Gospel Acclamation will be **Hallelujah**, which is a short hymn taken from <u>All Creation Sings</u>. This may seem like too many new things, but they are short pieces of our liturgy and the Worship and Music team feels they will become familiar very quickly. They are lovely and we hope you find that the change during the summer months is one that you enjoy.

We will be celebrating Pentecost by worshiping in the park with our Christian Brothers and Sisters from St. Mark's Episcopal; The United Methodist; The First Baptist; The Church of the Nazarene; and The Presbyterian Church. Join us for worship at 10:00 AM and remember to wear your **RED!**

We thank you for your flexibility in changing the way we are entering the sanctuary for worship. Many people like to go into the sanctuary and sit quietly before worship to pray and prepare their hearts and minds for worship. For this reason, one usher is now standing in the Narthex handing out bulletins and greeting you while the other usher is opening the door for you to enter the sanctuary. Keeping the doors closed allows for a quiet sanctuary as Peter plays before worship begins and it allows quiet time for those wishing to prepare for worship.


