Dear Friends in Christ,

I'm the kind of person who likes answers to the "why" questions of life. Knowing why things happen or why they are done a certain way helps me understand, accept and find meaning. This curiosity includes the church. For example, have you ever wondered why we use liturgy in worship? Why are our services so "formal" compared to some of the other protestant denominations?

There are many reasons Lutherans utilize liturgy. Here are some of them:

Liturgy connects us to our historical roots. Parts of our it goes back to the time of the early church. They adapted and reformed liturgy from the Jewish synagogue, and the process has been going on ever since. Using liturgy reminds us that the race of faith is like a relay race that is handed down from generation to generation.

Liturgy is both God-centered and Christ-centered. This means that worship is focused on the activity of the Triune God that is centered in the person and work of Jesus Christ. In other words, worship isn't primarily about "me" or "we". It's about God reconciling the world to Himself and our inclusion in God's saving work through baptism.

Liturgy teaches about all of God's work for us. Every liturgical year cycles through the themes of creation, redemption and sanctification so we receive the "whole work of God" on a regular basis.

Liturgy unites us with worshipers around the world. I find great joy in knowing that I am hearing the same Scripture lessons on a Sunday morning as Christians around the world. Utilizing a liturgical format of worship connects us with these believers and equips us to be about the work of God's kingdom wherever we live.

I have lots of other "why" questions about church. How about you? Please share them with me so we can explore them together in future newsletters.

Meeting Our Core Value Goal - Worship

We identified worship as one of our core values. The Church Council set a goal of including five people in new areas of worship leadership by Christmas. Worship Leadership Roles

Altar Guild: works with another person to prepare communion before worship/wash and put away communion ware after worship.

Assisting Minister: helps the pastor lead worship by reading Scripture, leading the prayers and serving communion.

Choir: sings an anthem in worship biweekly and rehearses every week between September and May.

Counter: works with another person after worship to count the offering and drop off the deposit at Lyons National Bank.

Reader: (also known as lector) leads the litany at the end of the service and sometimes leads the Psalm and reads the Scripture.

Sound Board: monitors the microphones during worship to help worshipers hear the pastor, assisting minister and reader.

Usher: works with another usher to hand out bulletins and greet worshipers before the service begins. During worship, count the attendees, collect the offering and dismiss people for communion. After worship, turn out the lights and fans in the sanctuary and lock the outside doors.

Worship and Music Committee: meets monthly to plan the worship services.

Zoom: greets worshipers as they sign onto Zoom and monitor the power point during worship.

HAVE YOU EVER WONDERED WHAT GOES INTO PLANNING A WORSHIP SERVICE?

Have you ever wondered about what goes into planning each Sunday morning's worship service?

The process begins with Pastor Lori. Pastor Lori gathers the lessons she will be preaching on for a Sunday morning. She captures the over-riding theme or main idea found in the scripture for the day. Pastor then selects three hymns for that Sunday based on the given lessons. The *Gathering Hymn* gathers us in as a congregation, beginning our service with praise and thanksgiving to God. The *Hymn of the Day* reflects the sermon that we have heard and with words and music enhances the spoken word of the lessons and of the sermon. The *Sending Hymn* ties everything from the service together and sends us out into the world, fed for the week to guide us in our daily lives. **All three hymns reflect the main idea of the sermon and spoken word of the lessons.**

When we enter a new season of the church year, Pastor looks at the Communion Setting, the Prayer for Illumination, The Creed, the Offertory Hymn, and the Benediction and shares the seasonal changes with the Worship Team which will be used throughout the season, such as Pentecost, Epiphany, Lent, Advent.

After all this is complete, Pastor Lori sends the information to the worship team members. The team is asked to read over the lessons, to look at the hymn suggestions, and then select hymns for communion which again enhance the spoken word for the day. The worship team does this piece before coming to the monthly meeting!

As the organist, Peter uses the information which Pastor Lori sends to the entire team to select the music he uses for the prelude, offertory, and postlude as well as the music he plays while we all enter church prior to worship at 10:00 AM. The hymn explanation which Peter provides each week in the bulletin, is based on the Hymn of the Day which Pastor Lori has selected.

The worship team meets once a month to plan for the month ahead. When Pastor Lori sends the Worship team members the lessons and hymn suggestions, it is for the four or five Sundays in the coming month. Pastor and the team plan the services, repeating each step for each Sunday of the month. We look at Pastor's suggested hymns, sometimes

changing them and then the team selects the communion hymns. We are careful to select hymns for communion which again enhance the theme of the day while selecting hymns which are familiar to the congregation.

Planning together is a wonderful process! We on the Worship Team hope that your worship time at St. Paul's is rich and meaningful. We hope that you see how all of the pieces "tie together" to enhance worship for you whether it is in spoken word, words of a hymn, or the music itself. Thanks be to God that we "GET TO" hear His Word and sing His praises each and every week and are blessed to go forth as His disciples in this world refreshed and renewed!


Share Your Gift of Music
