Dear Friends in Christ,

November is a month for people to acknowledge the people and things they're most thankful for. It's good to be thankful! The Bible even tells us in 1 Thessalonians 5:18, "give thanks in all circumstances, for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus."

Did you notice what this verse says? "Give thanks in <u>all</u> circumstances". Does that mean that I have to give thanks when life isn't going the way I planned? What about if my candidate of choice doesn't win the presidential election? Or when something bad happens to me or someone I love? I hate to be the bearer of bad news but, yes. That's exactly what it means.

We all know that bad things are going to happen. People get sick. Feelings get hurt. Relationships go through tough times that may even lead to a breakup. It may be hard to see these types of situations as times to give thanks...but they are.

And here's why. Notice the word before the bold, italicized and underlined word, <u>all</u>. It's the word, in. We are to give thanks *in* all circumstances, not for the circumstances. That's because no matter what we are facing in life, God is still in control and God's presence is still with us. This means that God's love, God's mercy, God's compassion and all of the wonderful things God is and does are still with us. They're with us because we are God's beloved children. And to prove that, God sent Jesus so that everyone who believes in him can have eternal life.

So, in this month of reflecting on what we are most thankful for, the thing I'm most thankful for is this...the gift of life that Jesus provides through his death and resurrection. For it's through this that we are claimed as one of God's dear children. I'm thankful that God continues to go with us wherever we go. And it's my constant prayer that no matter what we experience in our personal lives or the life of our congregation, that you remember that God is with you and that you can lean on Him all the time.


Church Directory
