P: We confess our sins before God and one another.


Pause for silence and reflection.

(light candle 2)


R: A savior to deliver peace...

But you, O Bethlehem of Ephrathah, who are one of the little clans of Judah, from you shall come forth for me one who is to rule in Israel, whose origin is from of old, from ancient days. Therefore he shall give them up until the time when she who is in labor has brought forth; then the rest of his kindred shall return to the people of Israel. And he shall stand and feed his flock in the strength of the Lord, in the majesty of the name of the Lord his God. And they shall live secure, for now he shall be great to the ends of the earth; and he shall be the one of peace.

Hebrews 10:5-10

Consequently, when Christ came into the world, he said, "Sacrifices and offerings you have not desired, but a body you have prepared for me; in burnt offerings and sin offerings you have taken no pleasure. Then I said, 'See, God, I have come to do your will, O God' (in the scroll of the book it is written of me)." When he said above, "You have neither desired nor taken pleasure in sacrifices and offerings and burnt offerings and sin offerings" (these are offered according to the law), then he added, "See, I have come to do your will." He abolishes the first in order to establish the second. And it is by God's will that we have been sanctified through the offering of the body of Jesus Christ once for all.

And Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit and exclaimed with a loud cry, "Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb. And why has this happened to me, that the mother of my Lord comes to me? For as soon as I heard the sound of your greeting, the child in my womb leaped for joy. And blessed is she who believed that there would be a fulfillment of what was spoken to her by the Lord." 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Advent Credo

- A: It is not true that creation and the human family are doomed to destruction and loss—
- All: This is true: For God so loved the world that He gave his only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish but have everlasting life;
- A: It is not true that we must accept inhumanity and discrimination, hunger and poverty, death and destruction—
- All: This is true: I have come that they may have life, and that abundantly.
- A: It is not true that violence and hatred should have the last word, and that war and destruction rule forever—
- All: This is true: Unto us a child is born, unto us a Son is given, and the government shall be upon his shoulder, his name shall be called wonderful councilor, mighty God, the Everlasting, the Prince of peace.
- A: It is not true that we are simply victims of the powers of evil who seek to rule the world—
- All: This is true: To me is given authority in heaven and on earth, and lo I am with you, even until the end of the world.
- A: It is not true that we have to wait for those who are specially gifted, who are the prophets of the Church before we can be peacemakers—
- All: This is true: I will pour out my spirit on all flesh and your sons and daughters shall prophesy, your young men shall see visions and your old men shall have dreams.

A: It is not true that our hopes for liberation of humankind, of justice, of human dignity of peace are not meant for this earth and for this history—

All: This is true: The hour comes, and it is now, that the true worshipers shall worship God in spirit and in truth.

A: So let us journey through Advent in hope, even hope against hope.

All: Let us see visions of love and peace and justice. Let us affirm with humility, with joy, with faith, with courage: Jesus Christ—the life of the world. Amen.

Hymn Notes "No Wind at the Window" ACS 906

John Bell (1949-) from Kilmarnock in Ayrshire, Scotland intended to be a music teacher but was called to ministry. He served as a youth pastor for the Church of Scotland and became aware of a lack of hymns representing the poor, that there was little helping us to see the plight of our brothers and sisters suffering poverty and persecution. He works around the world as lecturer in the renewal of congregational worship.

"No wind at the window" gives us an image of Mary's life as a person living in the quiet isolation of the impoverished. But the angel is kind and explains to Mary that she is requested to be the mother of God's son. This son will be "both victor and victim, both yours and divine." The fourth stanza is in the voice of the narrator tells us that although no benefit was promised to Mary, she said "yes."

COLUMCILLE is an Irish melody arranged by John Bell. Its four, four measure phrases are A B C D. The melody in A ascends haltingly and B descends more directly. The melody in C ascends more confidently with a suddenly rich harmonic language and D continues its ascent before dropping back down dramatically. The rising tenor line in the final phrase offers a major chord ending for the final stanza, thus accomplishing God's intent for this incarnation moment in the Annunciation. Although the tune is in the minor it does not reflect sadness or darkness. It is a tune of great strength. In Bell's arrangement the melody is anchored by parallel motion in the two lower parts. (bass and tenor) The rhythm in ¾ time has a surging quality, which, when combined with the harmony creates a strong feeling of the inevitable realization of God's will and plan for the coming of the Savior of humanity.
