Pause for silence and reflection.


P: God who was and is and is to come,

R: But the angel brought good news,


All: A message of new hope, new peace, new love, new joy to be given.

# **Prayer for Illumination**

for see—I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is the Messiah, the Lord. This will be a sign for you: you will find a child wrapped in bands of cloth and lying in a manger." And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host, praising God and saying, "Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace among those whom he favors!" When the angels had left them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Let us go now to Bethlehem and see this thing that has taken place, which the Lord has made known to us." So they went with haste and found Mary and Joseph, and the child lying in the manger. When they saw this, they made known what had been told them about this child; and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds told them. But Mary treasured all these words and pondered them in her heart. The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen, as it had been told them.


Following the sermon, there is a time of silence for reflection and quiet meditation. Our liturgy is made up not only of words, gestures, and music, but also moments of silence.



#### **Nicene Creed**

A: With the whole church, let us confess our faith.





#### **Postlude**

#### Hymn Notes "Of the Father's Love Begotten" ELW 295

This hymn was written in the 5th century by Marcus Aurelius Clemens Prudentius (348-413?) Born in what is now northern Spain Prudentius was a well educated lawyer and twice provincial governor. Around 392 he abandoned public life for asceticism. He became one of the most popular Medieval writers of hymns and sacred and secular poetry in which he drew comparisons and connections between Hellenic and Christian thought and philosophies. His influence remained strong into the 1300s. The text in Latin begins "Corde natus ex parentis," "Of the parent sole begotten." Only in translation did the gender inclusive become "father." John Mason Neale translated it in 1851 and Henry Williams Baker added the final verse doxology for the 1861 "Hymns, ancient and modern."

The poetry is direct and filled with the common images of prophecy through fulfillment in birth and resurrection. The Passion is not mentioned.

DIVINIUM MYSTERIUM is from the 13th century and first appeared in Piae Cantiones (1582) by Theodoric Petri. It was written in ¾ time with alternating half and quarter notes. This version still exists in the Episcopal "Hymnal 1982." Winifred Douglas (1867-1944) returned it to its chant notation of equal note values, the version in which the music flows better.

Most of the phrases begin with a diatonic tetrachord (four ascending notes with the half step between 3-4.) However, the third phrase begins on the note directly above the end of

the second phrase and rises to the octave above the primary note, thus completing the full octave scale for the text "He is Alpha and Omega."

These 4 note tetrachord phrase beginnings date back to Greek modes, which are the four note invocational pitches used when performing Greek oratory and epic poetry. Many congregations are apprehensive of this type of chant notation since only pitches are represented. The actual rhythm is all equal, but the notes are grouped in 2s and 3s, depending on number of syllables and if the phrase is ending. I will clearly show this as I play it through before singing. My best advice for singing this is to remember that chant style is flowing and the pauses on the long notes are brief. Keep it moving at speaking speed.
