

Liturgy Components for Trinity Sunday: Our Hymn of Praise will be Father Most Holy which is ELW 415. The Gospel Acclamation that day will be God's Word is Our Great Heritage ELW 509. We will use pieces of Setting Three for the Communion liturgy.

We are now entering the lengthy season of Pentecost where our paraments remain green, a sign of growth in the church and in our faith. June 22-August 31 is known as Early Pentecost. There will be a few things in our worship service that will be different beginning June 22, 2025. These changes are not meant to confuse, but to help enhance our worship time together in word and in music. As we learn new hymns and settings, we grow together in our faith, discipleship, and love for God and each other.

Pentecost 10:00 AM

The Hymn of Praise, the Gospel Acclamation, and the Communion liturgy are taken from Setting 12 which is found in the new music supplement, <u>All Creation Sings</u>. We will use an Affirmation of Faith as our Creed during this time. It follows the Apostle's Creed, the wording is different, yet the meaning is the same. The Offertory is also from <u>All Creation</u> <u>Sings and</u> is a hymn entitled *God of the Fertile Fields*. Throughout June, July, and August, rather than Pastor Lori saying the Benediction, we will be singing a hymn entitled May the *God of Hope Go with Us* which is also found in <u>All Creation Sings</u>.

The Worship and Music Team is always open to hear your thoughts on the new pieces used during worship. Sing them and hear them in the service for a couple of weeks, and let us know how they enhance worship for you, or what you like or don't like about them. Worship is our relationship with God in action and as individuals coming together as a community. We are blessed by His love and His word to go and be His disciples in the world around us. Thanks be to God!

Ecumenical Pentecost Worship Service

We will be celebrating the festival of Pentecost this year with four other churches on Sunday, June 8th at 10:00 am on the Courthouse lawn. The offering will go to support the feeding ministry at ProAction. You are also encouraged to bring a nonperishable food item for their food pantry.

Parish Life Sign-up


